Subject: Patrol Entrance Testing

The Randall County Sheriff's Office is currently taking applications for the position of Patrol Deputy. Prospective outside applicants will need to complete an application by October 7th, 2021. Current Sheriff's Office employees, who would like to transfer to Patrol, will need to submit a letter to me by the same deadline. Testing will begin on Oct 12th, 2021. On October 12th, applicants will complete the physical agility course, the firearms proficiency testing, and the written test. The oral interview will be scheduled for later in the day. In order to qualify for the oral interview, you will need to pass all physical agility tests and score an 80% or better on the firearm proficiency testing. The results of the written test will figure in on the accumulative score. A fail on any of the agility tests or scores below an 80% in firearms testing will make you ineligible for the oral interview. Once I receive all applications/letters, I will contact you to give further specifics.

A current TCOLE Peace Officer license is required to be eligible to test. The Sheriff's Office reserves the right to amend this process at any time.

The top few applicants from the following categories will make the final list. Scoring for the Patrol list will be as follows:

7 Points -	Advanced Peace Officer Certificate
8 Points -	Master Peace Officer Certificate

5 Points -	Associate Degree
7 Points -	Bachelor's Degree
8 Points -	Master's Degree
5 Points -	Intoxilyzer Operator
5 Points -	ID Technician
5 Points -	Firearms Instructor
5 Points -	Field Training Officer
5 Points -	TCOLE Instructor Certified
8 Points -	Law Enforcement Supervision Experience
5 Points -	Medical Certifications (ECA/EMT/EMT-P)
25 Points -	2 Points for each complete year of service with Randall County; or,
25 Points -	1 Point for each complete year of service with another law enforcement agency
535 -	Total Possible Points

The final list will be compiled from highest score to lowest and sent to the Sheriff for approval.
